This is what happened this week when the families of Durban detainees took food for them—as was normal procedure.

### **Mrs. SUZMAN**

In Johannesburg, Mrs. Helen Suzman, Progressive Party M.P. for Houghton, asked to see the detainees. She was fobbed off. Now she intends to seek assurances on their condition from the Minister of Police, Mr. S. L. Muller.

Now a worried Mrs. Kiruba Moodley sits at home, denied the opportunity of taking food for her husband, Durban lecturer Mr. Indris Moodley.

Mrs. Moodley told "The Graphic" that she was very concerned about her husband because she was given an assurance by Lt.-Col. Steenkamp, the head of the Security Police in Durban, that her husband was well and as long as he was in charge she had no need to fear.

But now she has learnt that Lt.-Col. Steenkamp is away on leave till the end of the year and she fears for her husband's health.

### **NO FOOD**

A relative of Miss Fatima Wadi, a final year science student, said she cried all the way home when she was told that no food could be taken to the detainees.

The two other detainees in Durban are Mohammed Timol, a textile engineer and brother of Ahmed Timol who died while in detention, and Mr. Yacoob Varachia, also a textile engineer.
