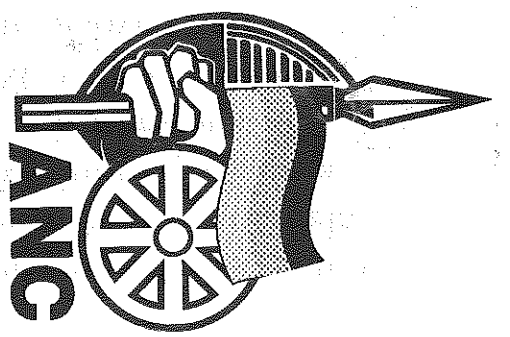

DR YUSUF DADOO MEMORIAL MEETING

An undisputed giant of the South African freedom struggle, Dr Yusuf Dadoo died in exile in London on September 10, 1983.

To commemorate the 10th anniversary of the death of this outstanding son of our beloved country, a close friend and comrade-in-arms of Nelson Mandela, Walter Sisulu, Oliver Tambo, Joe Slovo and Govan Mbeki, Jimmy LaGuma, Dr Monty Naicker, Molvi Cachalia, Bram Fischer, Ahmed Kathrada and other leading figures of the liberation movement, the ANC will be holding a commemorative meeting to pay tribute to one of our late beloved and respected leaders.

Yusuf Dadoo was a household word among members of the oppressed communities in the late thirties, forties and fifties for his relentless struggle against racial tyranny and oppression, and became synonymous with resistance and struggle. His selfless courage in the face of adversity and repression; of devotion and dedication to the cause of the oppressed - both here and abroad - served to unify countless of our people under the banner of the liberation movement.

Forced into exile in the sixties, this gallant son of Krugersdorp became an important pillar, together with his late comrades OR Tambo, JB Marks, Moses Kotane and Michael Harmel in the international mobilisation against the apartheid state. As Vice Chairman of the ANC Revolutionary Council, he played a pivotal role in soliciting support for our cause and in galvanising the anti apartheid forces. "Doc" never wavered or faltered in his beliefs and was convinced that freedom was within our grasp and that no matter how tough the battle our cause shall be triumphant.

We call upon all who cherish the ideals of Yusuf Dadoo - peace, freedom and liberty; of justice and fair play - to join us in paying our humble tribute to the memory of a truly great South African who, who died in harness a true soldier in the cause of human freedom and dignity.
